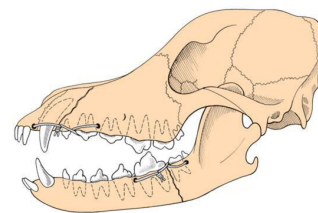

Non-Invasive Jaw Fracture Repair

In our lecture about jaw fracture repair we will discuss various non-invasive jaw fracture repair techniques including muzzle therapy, interdental wiring, maxillomandibular fixation, symphyseal wiring and acrylic splinting. The benefits, materials and individual techniques will be described in detail. There will be cases to walk through to aid in technical understanding. Pre and post-op management will also be discussed and the importance of intraoral imaging in fracture repair. Questions are welcomed.
